Analysis of Teacher Evaluation by Students year: 2014-15

Evaluation of Teacher by students was carried out for both Arts and Science faculty in the year 2014-15. Committee has prepared evaluation form which includes questions related to the general attitude and subject knowledge of the teacher. Students evaluated teacher's performance objectively based on five point scale: 1) Excellent 2) Very Good 3) Good 4) Average and 5) Below Average.

The performance of 33 teachers was evaluated by students of B. A. II and B. Sc. II. Out of them 22 teachers got very good and 8 teachers got good and three teachers got average remark.

After going through the feedback reports, principal instructed the teachers regarding the improvement of performance and encourage students to participate in the extra-curricular activities along with academic.

Annexure-III

Best Practices: 2014-15

1. Parent-Teacher Visit to Students' House

Objective:-To inform the progress and attendance to parents regarding their wards and counseling them for the importance of students' attendance in the classroom.

Action: It is common trend that students from Arts and Commerce faculty neglect to attend the classes in colleges. Most of the students of our college come from rural area. Therefore, the problem of attendance of students has become crucial than other colleges where most of the students come from local area

Our institution and management are very keen and give special attention towards classroom attendance of students. In the second term of the academic year-2014-15, it was observed that students of Arts faculty were irregular. So a meeting of staff members was held and suggested to prepare a plan to visit to students' house with the purpose to inform the parents regarding overall performance and attendance of their wards. In the previous year (2013-14), in order to improve the attendance, college had arranged the parents' meet but this year we decided to contact their parents personally.

A group of 4 to 5 teachers was formed and assigned a list of students. They met parents and discussed with them regarding overall progress of their wards. Teachers understood the problems of students as well as parents. The importance of classroom attendance was brought to the notice of parents. The teachers also emphasized the significance of participation in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities conducted by the college. Teachers appealed parents concerning their wards' regular attendance in the class.

Outcome: Parents welcomed and appreciated this activity. Some parents motivated their wards made financial arrangements for their wards to attend classes.

2. Felicitation of Students' for Contribution in Creative Writing

Objective:-To motivate students to think and write independently on important socio-economic and cultural issues as a career option.

Action:- Usually, students are evaluated on the basis of their performance in the examination. But, the creative talent in students' is not taken into account and they do not get ample scope for this in higher education. While reading students' writing in college magazine, it was observed that students have ability to think and write on socio-economic, cultural issues etc. Such practice may help students to find better prospect in literature. Considering the

significance of such career option, the students who contributed in the college magazine were felicitated and encouraged to flourish as a writer.

Outcome: This distinctive activity created positive attitude among students and encouraged them to pursue the path of literary work.

3. Visit to Old Age Home

Objective:- To inculcate moral and human values such as respect to elder persons (senior citizens) among students.

Action:- In the academic year 2013-14, the college made an attempt to inculcate moral and human values among N. S. S. volunteers. The volunteers visited old age home at Kupwad and realized the problems of aged persons and expressed their concern to them. Due to good response and positive result of this practice, in the academic year-2014-15, it was suggested that all the students should visit to old age home and understand the difficulties being faced by old persons. A visit of each department was arranged to old aged home, Kupwad run by the Chairman of the institution, Hon'ble Sharad Patil (Sir), Ex. M.L.A and M.L.C. Throughout the year most of the departments (Arts and Science faculty) arranged visits to old age home. The students contributed by cleaning the campus and dialogue with old persons.

Outcome: This unique activity created optimistic approach among the students to respect the senior citizens not only in their family but also other aged persons from society.
